ANNE'S NOTES The Salt Grass Trail, Part II

Last month, this column detailed how I fulfilled a life-long dream of riding on the Salt Grass Trail; this month is the second (and final) installment of that column. Riding along the trail, I met all sorts of people. Of course, most of them were cowboys. Real cowboys. Ranchers. These people brought their own horses, their own horse/RV trailer (So, yes, they sort of did sleep with their horses. Or almost.), watering troughs, hay bales . . . you get the idea. As I was going to my car one day, one of the cowboys asked if that was my car, the one with the license plate that says "HAY." Yes, it is. He was wondering if I was in the hay selling business. Um, nope.

I had two favorite parts of the trail. First, I loved riding my horse on roads that were barely roads, past farms and ranches and just land. I loved it when horses far off in the distance would come running over to the fence line to say Hello! or Whatcha Doin'? I loved clip-clopping over bridges that spanned small creeks as well as the Brazos River, not far from Washington-on-the-Brazos, the birthplace of Texas. This year, much more than last, our wagon had a DVD player and speakers, so a lot of the ride was accompanied by mostly country music, with a quick round of YMCA thrown in now and then, but I managed to sneak in a few trail-appropriate bluegrass songs. They were quite well received. And yes, I did play some tunes from our own Lonestar Bluegrass Band. Now, if you read last month's column here, you remember that LSBG's leader, Chris Hirsch's, grandpa (or great-grandpa?) was one of the founders of the Salt Grass Trail.

My other favorite part, and this is in no particular order, was waving to the people who came out to wave to us. I was somewhat surprised at how many people came out of their business to watch and wave. And by the construction crews who paused from working to come over and wave and holler. But my most favorites were the school kids. I told my story (the one I told here last month) (about waving to the trail riders back in the 1950s) to my fellow riders, and as we passed hundreds of kids, one of my riding buddies turned to me and said, "There you are," referring to the bright, happy faces who were, indeed, so very thrilled at seeing real cowboys.

And, so, I'll close with the quote that I opened with last month.

Today's riders hit the trail in an attempt to recreate the Old West, and in doing so, find a common ground that links us all to the show. A sense of history and pride resides in each rider, igniting envy and intrigue in each child as they watch the trail riders and hope to one day join them. (www.rodeohouston.com)






